City Assistance:

- **DDA Façade Grants** The City of Hancock Downtown Development Authority offers 1:1 matching funds up to \$10,000 for approved exterior improvements to business locations and up to a maximum \$500 for architectural services. DDA meetings are scheduled at 6:00 PM, the first Monday of the month at City Hall Council Chambers.

- **Small Business JumpStart Program** The City of Hancock Downtown Development Authority offers up to \$3,000 for specified expenses for new small business locating in the DDA district. DDA meetings are scheduled at 6:00 PM, the first Monday of the month at City Hall Council Chambers.

Regional Assistance:

- Houghton County Brownfield Redevelopment Authority (HCBRA) Provides significant incentives to developers to facilitate the redevelopment of blighted, obsolete or tax reverted qualifying sites throughout the County and work to clean up contaminated soil and ground water.
 - Incentive: The primary incentives include the use of tax increment financing authorities (TIF) along with the management of brownfield grants and loans.
