ORDINANCE 304

AN ORDINANCE TO DESIGNATE AN ENFORCING AGENCY TO DISCHARGE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CITY OF HANCOCK LOCATED IN HOUGHTON COUNTY, AND TO DESIGNATE REGULATED FLOOD HAZARD AREAS UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE STATE CONSTRUCTION CODE ACT, ACT NO. 230 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF 1972, AS AMENDED

THE CITY OF HANCOCK ORDAINS:

- **Sec. 1.** Agency Designated. Pursuant to the provisions of the state construction code, in accordance with Section 8b(6) of Act 230, of the Public Acts of 1972, as amended, the Houghton County Building Inspector is hereby designated as the enforcing agency to discharge the responsibility of the City of Hancock under Act 230, of the Public Acts of 1972, as amended, State of Michigan. The County of Houghton assumes responsibility for the administration and enforcement of said Act throughout the corporate limits of the community adopting this ordinance.
- **Sec. 2. Code Appendix Enforced.** Pursuant to the provisions of the state construction code, in accordance with Section 8b(6) of Act 230, of the Public Acts of 1972, as amended, Appendix G of the Michigan Building Code shall be enforced by the enforcing agency within the jurisdiction of the community adopting this ordinance.
- Sec. 3. Designation of Regulated Flood Prone Hazard Areas. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Flood Insurance Study (FIS) and the Flood Insurance Rate Map(s) (FIRMS) are adopted by reference for the purposes of administration of the Michigan Construction Code, and declared to be a part of Section 1612.3 of the Michigan Building Code, and to provide the content of the "Flood Hazards" section of Table R301.2(1) of the Michigan Residential Code.
- **Sec. 4. Repeals.** All ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.
- **Sec. 5. Publication.** This ordinance shall be effective after legal publication and in accordance with the provisions of the Act governing same.

This Ordinance was enacted by the City Council of the City of Hancock, Houghton County, Michigan on the 18th day of September, 2019. Effective the 18th day of October, 2019.

ORDINANCE #305

"AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 291 AND AMEND SECTION ORDINANCE 198 RELATING TO WATER CHARGES."

Section 1. The water rate shall be \$9.05 per one thousand (1000) gallons of metered Water. The minimum bill shall be \$9.05 per month.

Section 2. This rate increase will commence with the October 18, 2019 utility billing.

The foregoing proposed Ordinance was introduced in writing at the regular meeting of the Hancock City Council held on Wednesday, August 21, 2019 at 6:00 p.m.

A Public Hearing is scheduled for Wednesday, September 18, 2019 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers prior to the regular meeting. Copies of this proposed ordinance are available at the Clerk's Office Monday-Friday 8 am to 5 pm.

This proposed ordinance will be presented to the Hancock City Council for adoption or rejection at the regular meeting of the Hancock City Council to be held on Wednesday, September 18, 2019.

This is a \$1.20 increase from \$7.85 to \$9.05 per 1000 gallons of metered water.
